### Mailbox Guidelines

When replacing your mailbox, the main concerns for larger boxes (beyond a homogenous appearance) is that the width of the replacement box is narrow enough to allow your neighbor to have the same options as you.

Each stand allows 12 inches total for each box (including gaps in-between). Given the need for some clearance between boxes, this leaves a max width of 11 inches. Once the policy is in place, non-conforming and poor condition boxes will be required to replace with a new mailbox.

An example of a locking, higher capacity model that fits the bill is the “Oregon Columbia” model, which can be found at [www.usmailboxes.com](http://www.usmailboxes.com) (and other sources). Another is the “Architectural Oasis Jr.” (model #6200Z-10), available at Lowe’s/Home Depot. Similar models are located on a stand at the first cul-de-sac in Division 2 (SE 299<sup>th</sup> Ct.)

Please put your house number on your mailbox – it will make delivering our mail so much easier for our mail carrier.
